



CHRISTMAS GREETINGS FROM THE 'FRONT'.

During the First World War it was common for units of all services to produce their own distinctive Christmas cards. Some were based simply on unit insignias, while others were of a more imaginative and artistic nature. Many examples have survived, and still come to hand from time to time. The card reproduced above was drawn in France by an unknown artist attached to the 54th Wing R.A.F.
